The Legend Of Hans Roth

by Howard Lorriman

Back in the 14th century, this tone poem describes how Hans Roth, a peasant from the small village of Rumisberg, saved the nearby city of Solothurn from an attack by its rivals and their commanders Count Rudolf of Kyburg and Duke Leopold III of Habsburg. Hans Roth saved Solothurn from plunder and occupation. As result Solothurn kept its independence and formed an own government and dominion.

In a snowy winter night in November 1382, Hans Roth sitting behind a stove in the small tavern "Schlüssel" in Wiedlisbach, witnessed the secret plans of attacking the city. But discovered, he had been forced to swear not telling any living person about what he heard.

But at night, he ran by taking hidden paths towards Solothurn to warn the citizens. By putting his clogs on back to front, he disguised his tracks in the snow and so deceived the traitors. Arriving at the town gate he called out his warning - but not to a person but the statue of Saint Urs. This way, the guards could warn Solothurn's citizens on time and Hans did not break his vow.

Hans Roth's courageous run to Solothurn is not forgotten and it had been honoured by the "Hans Roth Waffentlauf", taking place once a year from 1954-2008 over a distance of 26 kilometers.

letter E

Hans Roth is discovered and made to swear he would never tell any living person what he has just heard

letter F

meanwhile the city of Solothurn slumbers amid the winter snow unaware of the impending danger

letter K

Hans Roth escapes and makes his way through the snow to warn the people of Solothurn. To disguise his tracks, he puts his clogs on back to front

letter N

At the city gate he calls out his warning - but not to a person but a statue of Saint Urs. That way he does not break his promise not to tell any living person

letter O

The city guards over hear Hans Roth's warning and the city is saved

Diese Tondichtung beschreibt wie Hans Roth, ein Bauer aus dem Dorf Rumisberg, im 14. Jahrhundert die nahegelegene Stadt Solothurn vor dem geplanten Überfall der rivalisierenden Berner unter der Führung von Rudolf von Kyburg und dem Habsburger Herzog Leopold III warnte. Wäre die Stadt eingenommen worden, hätte Solothurn seine Unabhängigkeit verloren und nicht einen eigenen Kanton aufbauen können.

In einer kalten Winternacht im November 1382 sass Hans Roth hinter dem Kachelofen im "Schlüssel" zu Wiedlisbach. Dort wurde er Zeuge des heimlichen Plans, Solothurn zu überfallen. Als er entdeckt wurde, musste er den Verrätern schwören, keiner lebenden Person davon zu erzählen.

Doch in der Nacht rannte er auf versteckten Wegen nach Solothurn, um die Menschen dort zu warnen. Um seine Verfolger zu täuschen, zog er seine Holzschuhe verkehrt herum an, sodass seine Spuren im Schnee von der Stadt wegführten. Am Stadttor angekommen, wendete er sich an die Statue des Sankt Urs und berichtete ihm von der drohenden Gefahr. Die Stadtwachen hörten dies und warnten sogleich die Solothurner Bevölkerung und Hans Roth brach somit seinen Schwur nicht.

Auch heute noch, ist Hans Roth's mutiger Lauf nach Solothurn nicht vergessen. Von 1954-2008 wurde er mit dem jährlich stattfindenden "Hans Roth Waffenlauf" geehrt, der in einer Distanz von 26 Kilometern von Wiedlisbach nach Solothurn führte.

Am Stadttor angelangt wendet sich an die Statue von Sankt Urs, dem Stadtheiligen und berichtet diesem laut von der drohenden Gefahr. Auf diese Weise bricht Hans Roth seinen Schwur nicht

Buchstabe O

Die Stadtwachen hören Hans Roth's Warnungen und alarmieren die Bevölkerung. Solothurn ist gerettet!
