## FOREWORD

These Concert pieces have been carefully selected to give a wide range of styles for entertaining concert programmes. Hopefully, the techniques improved through working with the studies in Part 1 will make these concert works more safisfying in performance. Not all techniques from Part 1 appear in the Concert Selection, as they would not be appropriate eg Dissonance and Multiple Metre, but you should find that the concert works will have more confidence evident from both conductor and band.

## BRUCE FRASER - BIOGRAPHY OF THE ARRANGE

Bruce Fraser has established a reputation as a multi-faceted composer in Europe with Lomond Musicss range of titles for young brass and concert bands. He also has had published a vast number of compositions and arrangements for concert band and brass which are regularly used in contests. There have been many commissions for a variety of groups, including a Concerto for Trumpet and Orchestra for John Wallace, SUN for BBC Young Brass player Katrina Marzella and a Concery for Tuba virtuoso James Gourlay, which is availan Brass Band, Concert Band, Piano and Orchestran accompaniments.
His work, HELLAS for Trombone and no vias the set piece for the British Trombone Society competition for young players 2008, e duet TWIN SLIDES, commissioned by Brett Baker of the famous Black Dyke Band, was proiered recently by Brett and other trombone virtuoso Chris Jeans.
As a conductor he has been conductiny brass bands, choirs and wind bands for over thirty years. As an adjudicator he has appeared Music Festivals, Brass Band Competitions and Wind Band Festivals throughout the UK and $E$ rope. He recently was on the panel of Jurors of a Composition Competition in Italy. He is emand working with young bands and ensembles in workshops and concerts.
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In 2006 he took early retirement as Head of Music at Buckhaven High School in Fife and is developing his career as a composer and adjudicator. His work IMPERIUM was selected as the 2007 Third Section National Brass Band Test Piece, and ALTA VISTA was the 2009 Fourth Section National brass band Test Piece. He has a busy writing schedule and is always looking for new composition and other musical opportunities.
